

Risk/Vulnerability Assessment

Long, open and porous border with Baksa District, Assam stretching
 45 kilometers

 High frequency of Bhutanese traveling via Nganglam - 582 people per day on an average (22,724 people screened as of 15.03.2020)

 High frequency of non-national day visitors - 240 people per day on an average (9147 non-nationals screened as of 15.03.2020)

Contd...

 Huge number of trucks plying daily to various destinations (Bhutanese - 75, Non-Bhutanese - 39)

 High frequency of Bhutanese casual visitors across the border (Daodhara and Rangapani)

Contd...

 Lack of advocacy, surveillance and screening of COVID-19 across the border

 Possible outbreak of dengue and malaria with onset of monsoon

 Non-declaration of travel history by the travelers at the checkpoint


Measures Undertaken

- Emergency stakeholders' Coordination Meeting conducted on 2nd
 February 2020
- Constituted Dungkhag COVID-19 Response Team
- Established health screening point at Integrated Checkpoint, Pelzomthang on 01.02.2020 (22,724 people screened as of 15.03.2020)
- Conducted aggressive advocacy and awareness in schools, institutions, business communities and Gewogs

Contd...

- Notified public to avoid mass gatherings and casual travels to border towns
- Instituted hand sanitizing system in institutions and offices
- Established Flu Clinics at Nganglam Hospital and RBA premises
- Established health screening facility at DCCL Truck Parking and plant entry gate
- Set up isolation and quarantine facilities

Continue implementing the existing measures put in place

 Engage Local Leaders of the Three Gewogs and Throm Representatives for advocacy and awareness

Enforce the SoPs and Government Directives

Situation: Yellow

Scenario: No confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Nganglam

 Conduct daily COVID-19 awareness and screening at the Truck Parking of the DCCL

 All schools in Nganglam will conduct advocacy and awareness during assembly everyday

 Nganglam Hospital conducting advocacy for passenger buses plying out of Nganglam

Additional Measures to be Implemented

- Set up interim checkpoints at Gasharibali Bridge and Drangsajab above the Dungkhag Guest House
- All asymptomatic travelers from affected countries shall be advised for home quarantine for 14 days from the day of arrival into the country
- Engage De-suups in creating awareness on COVID-19 prevention and control measures
- Monitor compliance with public notifications
- Mobilize health professionals from the pool of retired health officials

Situation: Orange

Scenario: one or more isolated confirmed cases in Nganglam without secondary transmission

- 1. Panic within the community
- 2. Panic purchasing leading to hoarding of essential food supplies and price escalation
- 3. Possible migration out of Nganglam

Situation: Orange

Scenario: one or more isolated confirmed cases in Nganglam without secondary transmission

- 4. Shortage of fuel and medicines
- 5. Pressure on the limited medical facilities at the Nganglam Hospital
- 6. Shortage of manpower for surveillance and support services
- 7. Adverse impact on tourism industry

Measures

- 1. Activate Incident Command System
- Activate Rapid Response Team led by Dr. Sonam Dolkar (SoP in place)
- 3. Partial lockdown of Nganglam
- 4. Scale up advocacy and counselling to address panic among population
- 5. Strictly monitor and regulate price of essential commodities
- 6. Closure of all schools
- 7. Alert medical back up teams from the three Gewog PHCs and Dzongkhag Hospital to remain on standby

Contd...

- 8. Mobilize Desuups, Red Cross Volunteers and Teachers (53+10+70)
- 9. Cordoning the designated isolation and quarantine facilities by the RBP
- 10. Strict enforcement of mandatory declaration of travel history
- 11. Continue enforcement of prohibition on all public gatherings
- 12. Provide advisory to avoid all non-essential travels to border towns

Contd...

13. Conduct coordination meetings with counterparts of Baksa on cross border movement of goods, border management and security

14. Step up health monitoring and surveillance in the Gewogs

15. Step up mobile surveillance along the border areas

16. Carry out contact tracing as per the established protocol

Situation: Red

Scenario: Multiple cases with local transmission

- Multiple cases in Nganglam and across the border
- Extreme panic within the community
- Mass exodus to the north
- Breakdown in supply chain of essential items
- Possible disruption of law and order in the community

Situation: Red

Scenario: Multiple cases with local transmission

• Extreme stress on health infrastructure, medical supplies, and manpower

Shortage of essential food items and fuel supply

Likelihood of COVID-19 infection spreading to neighbouring Dzongkhags

Non availability of ventilators

Profound impact on local economy

Measures:

Lockdown and complete sealing of border

 Mobilization of medical backup teams from Pema Gatshel hospital and Mongar Referral Hospital

 All medical supplies required for Nganglam will be mobilized from MSDD

Rationing the distribution of essential items

Projection of essential Food items for 50% of the population for 3 months

NB: The FCB Head Office has been requested to expedite the delivery of balance supplies.

Measures contd...

- Follow up with FCB Head Office to expeditiously replenish the food supply stock requirements for Nganglam
- Closely monitor and regulate the distribution of essential items
- Pursue aggressive advocacy and counselling to address panic among population
- Mobilize medical back up teams from the three Gewog Primary Health Centres and Dzongkhag Hospital
- Activate surge capacity from Mongar Referral Hospital and National Referral Hospital

Measures contd...

- Mobilize Ambulances from Yurung PHC, Pema Gatshel Hospital and from the pool of Government vehicles that have been identified and placed under the charge of the Transport Coordinator
- Monitor and restrict the movement of people out of Nganglam
- Operationalize the isolation and quarantine facilities
- Carry out contact tracing as per the established protocol in collaboration with RBP

Measures contd...

- Coordinate with counterparts across the border to restore supply chain
- Enforce prohibitions and curfew as and when necessary
- Relocate NCD and MCH services to RBA clinic
- Aggressive advocacy and communication in non affected places
- National level interventions needed to reverse economic downturn

Waste from Isolation Rooms

- 1. Treat with 0.5% bleaching solution for 25-30 minutes
- 2. Dispose off the waste by Dr. Nima Tshering, Infection Focal Person
- 3. Dead body
 - Handover the corpse to the deceased family member.

- Firewood to be arranged by Tandin Wangchuk, Forestry Officer, Nganglam
